Contrasting Countries: Travel around the world focusing on two continents. Firstly, travel to Africa and visit Kenya and South Africa. Before then making your way to South America to visit Chile and Brazil. You will investigate the physical and human Geography of the countries, immerse yourself in the natural world, track their economic growth, and consider the problems they face and what their future holds...

Check point: A topic assessment, testing knowledge and understanding and the ability to evaluate.

Raging Rivers: become confident with river features and causes of flooding, before comparing the impacts of floods in HIC and LICs.

The Spring line

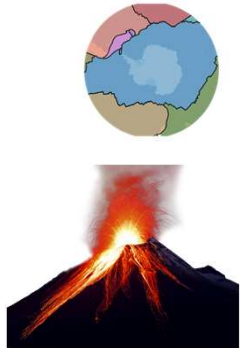
