

What is history and how have historians interpreted the Ancient world?
This unit will introduce students to what history is and get them to consider how historians have interpreted ancient history



Challenge
Explore the British museum, how has the museum displayed certain items and why have they been interpreted in this way?

How was the Medieval world governed and ruled?
A world view of how Medieval politics and empires were structured and how people existed within Medieval societies.



Check Point: Using our skills of interpreting the past to evaluate King John's reign.

How did the Black death impact and change the Medieval world?
An in depth study of how Medieval life and empires changed as a result of the Black Death, focussing on how the Silk Roads and the Mongol Empire were impacted.

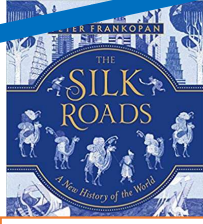
Check Point: Using knowledge of the Reformation to probe the causes of why Henry VIII broke from Rome?

How did the Reformation change England?
Henry VIII and his six wives is one of History's most famous stories, this unit looks at Henry's legacy of the Protestant Church and the impact to the Tudor family



Challenge:
Find out more about Henry's Six wives. Who were they and what impact or change did they bring about?

What was the Renaissance and how did it affect Early Modern Europe?
Europe's art and culture was rapidly changing during the 1500's. This unit will look at how religion began to impact Europe's culture and how lives were changed.



Challenge:
Explore the Silk Roads further by reading The Silk Roads by Peter Frankopan, made specifically so students can access a deeper understanding of History told from a less Eurocentric perspective.

How did European Expansion impact the Wider World?
As Europe began to expand, the discovery and destruction of civilisations started. This unit explores the impact of European expansion on the Americas and Africa



How has medical practice changed and progress over time?
An in depth study, focussing on the changing nature of medicine and its impact on the globe.

Check Point: Combining the skills from this year, we will interpret historians ideas about the Reformation, and investigate the causes of medical progress.

How has Southgate changed and developed?
This unit is an in depth study of local history, focussing on the local area of the school through time.
