Ashmole Primary Mural

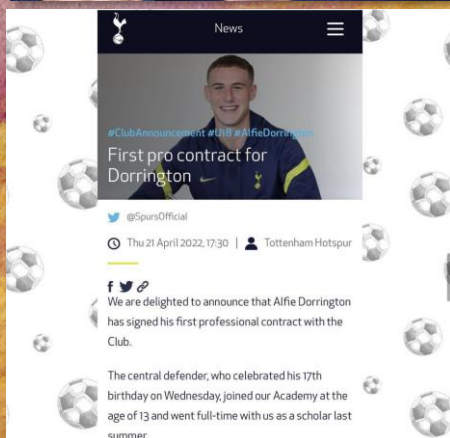

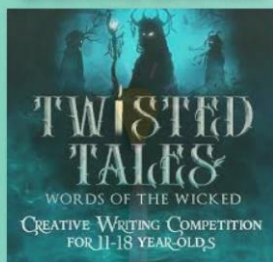


LOUGHBOROUGH VISIT

History Society - London Ambulance Service

In History Society this week, year 12 gathered to watch Jamie Somerville's (12SAN) presentation on the History of the London Ambulance Service. The bulk of the presentation consisted of a timeline of progression in technology and medical aid in the modern era. We started at the end of the 19th century, seeing the first horse-drawn ambulances established in London, and travelled across a period of technological advancements due to World Wars and improvements of social services, making us question in History Society whether the deadly wars had to occur in order to benefit a medically advanced society as our own. Jamie talked about the important of Voluntary Services such as the St John's Ambulance Brigade and the British Red Cross, the introduction of the NHS and the integral part played by the Air Ambulance. Did you know about the medical miracle performed by the Air Ambulance? On Christmas Eve 1993, they performed the first ever successful open heart surgery at the roadside, showcasing to the world the possibility of more immediate care without needing the facilities of a hospital.

'But what about the future, will there be self-driving ambulances?' asked one student. 'From what we have learnt from the past, human emotions such as empathy are as integral to care than the medical front,' answered Jamie. While technology may improve and certain jobs may be replaced by robots and computers, throughout history we have depended on empathy from other people in order to save lives, whether it be a World War 1 Medic, or a 21st century paramedic. What set this meeting apart from other History Societies was the personal involvement of Jamie, who holds the impressive position of Sargent in the St John's Ambulance, proving to us that just because an event in History happened two centuries ago, it doesn't mean it can't have a personal, impactful effect on our lives and futures. Furthermore, it highlighted to a classroom of inspired Year 12 students the relevance of learning about our past. - Joe N, History Scholar
