Year 12 Politics - The Lion King



The results were as follows: Certificate of Participation – 18%; Bronze – 29%; Silver – 33% and Gold – 20%

A special congratulations to Ruby C (Year 7) and Rohit C (Year 8) who qualified for the Junior Olympiad round. Only around 1,200 qualifying students were invited from the <u>Junior Mathematical</u> <u>Challenge</u> and we have 2 from our very own school!
