# Stories of the Holocaust

STUDENTS from across the capital were invited to meet survivors of the Holocaust as part of an educational project in Hendon on Monday.

Two 16-year-olds from Ashmole Academy in Southgate were among the group which visited the Holocaust Survivors' Centre in Church Road where members of the centre talked about their experiences during the Second World War and about their lives since 1945.

Eva Kugler, a member of the centre, said: "It can be painful to speak to young people about my history, but today I felt completely at ease. "It means so much to see that this new

generation understands the horrors of the Holocaust and will not forget the six million who perished."

The pupils have visited the concentration camp in Auschwitz-Birkenau, Poland, as part of a project called Lessons from Auschwitz and aim to teach others about the Holocaust.

Naomi Lynne, a student from Ashmole Academy, said: "The Holocaust Educational Trust's Lessons from Auschwitz Project has provided an incredible opportunity for me to expand my knowledge and further my understanding of the Holocaust in a way that is just not possible inside a classroom.

"It has been very special to meet with the survivors here at Jewish Care's Survivors' Centre and I look forward to playing my part in ensuring that their stories are never forgotten."
