With a £2 donation via ParentPay, staff and students can put on their jazziest festive jumpers and raise money for a good cause.




London Youth Games Cross Country

Secondly, Amelie's talk discussed the Arctic Tundra biome, specifically the hours of daylight, tourism in Norway, weather patterns and dangers that the Arctic faces due to climate change/global warming. The talk looked at the Norwegian archipelago Svalbard, it has very limited hours of daylight in the winter and limited hours of darkness in the summer, this is due to its northern latitude. The area is a tourist attraction due to its beautiful northern lights (aurora borealis).
