#### South East Group Regional Final - Golfing Success

Arnold in Year 10 represented Hertfordshire in the South East Group regional final for the Under 14's golf team on Sunday 12th September in what was always going to be a close encounter between Hertfordshire, Bedfordshire and Surrey, but who would be crowned champions remained on a knife edge until the individual results against Bedfordshire were known. The Final was played at Dulwich & Sydenham Golf Club on the outskirts of London, played as 10 triangular singles matches. The strength of the Surrey team was evident with a number of England players in the team, who'd won national competitions earlier in the year. As the match against Surrey ended a draw, the individual results against an inferior Bedfordshire side were going to be crucial in deciding the outcome of this final. Hertfordshire boys came out on top in nine of their matches, including Arnold's victory, and lost just the one. Surrey, however won nine matches against Bedfordshire and secured a half in the other. That half proved to be the deciding point for a Surrey victory.

The manager of the Hertfordshire Under 14's team said afterwards, "the boys have been a tremendous credit to their parents, the county and themselves throughout the year and will, I am sure, represent the county with distinction over the coming years at under 16's and under 18's level.
