



Last week, in his year 8 history lesson, Mr Falconer (Teacher of RS & History) conducted a role play and debate! This is a great book for A Level Historians and English students as it gives a great deal of context to life in the 16th Century and sets up the tumultuous struggle for religion in the 17th Century.'

MedSoc has started up again! We were privileged to have a guest speaker and Ashmole alumni Munuse Savash talk to some of our Biology students in Year 12 and Year 13. Munuse delivered an inspirational talk about her academic journey to now starting a PhD at the University of Oxford on gene editing. Her undergraduate project introduced her to the marvels of gene editing, particularly the use and development of CRISPR (a tool used to cut specific areas of the DNA) resulting in the independent completion of a CRISPR project for her research project. Her PhD project will also involve the use of CRISPR within human embryos with the aim of curing them from diseases. The development of CRISPR has been groundbreaking resulting in the founders gaining a Nobel Prize in Chemistry in 2020. She finished her presentation reminding our students to: work hard and grasp every opportunity, enjoy the moment and have faith in their abilities. Her talk certainly helped to inspire our own students in fulfilling their dreams. We are grateful to Munuse for taking the time to speak to them! – Ms Moll

Revision


Active Revision in RS

Mrs Gray (Teacher of RS) recently got her students up and out of their seats during a revision lesson!

“My Year 11 class were revising for a longer exam question on the topic Religion and Life Issues. To begin looking at the skill of evaluation needed for our longest question on the exam (12 marks) students needed to write an open ended debatable statement using the specification. They had prepared for this the previous lesson by creating revision resources. Students were asked to write this question on a post-it note and stick these around the room. They then went around different questions in small groups or pairs, discussing them. This sparked some interesting discussions. Students often considered not just their own views but how religious believers might approach the question; some were able to challenge views they heard. They then built on this by planning out answers, evaluating arguments and debating these in a group task”.




October: International Walk to School Month
