## The Tragedy of MacBeth

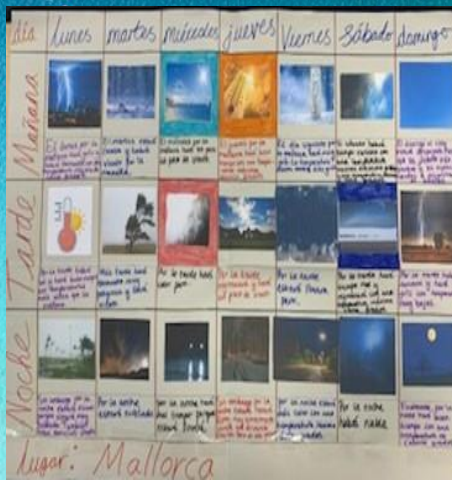

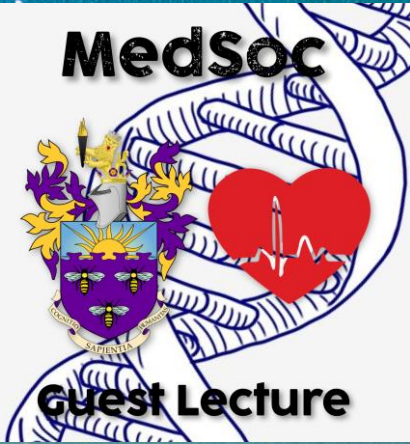
