Ashmole Poets Club

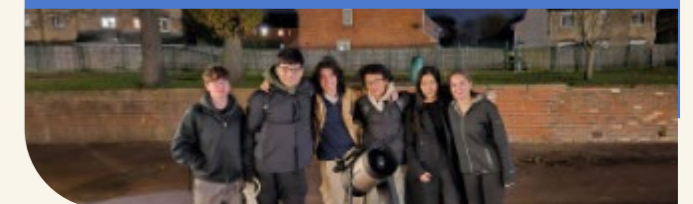

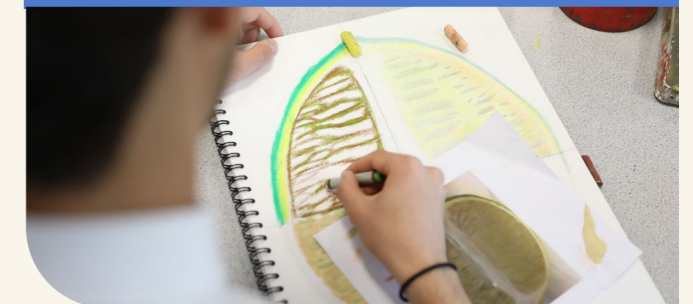


GCSE Art Club

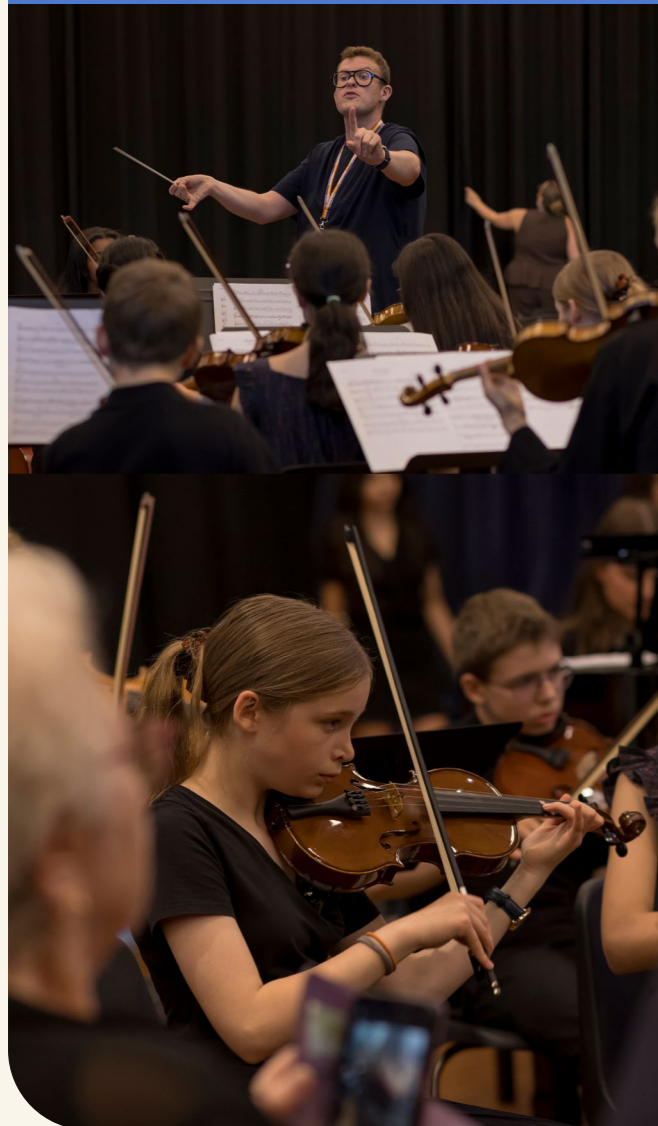


Orchestra

Show Orchestra

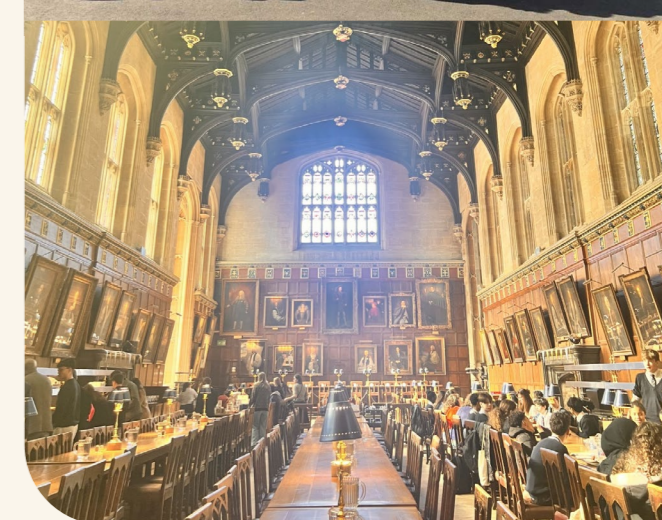

Ashmole’s Oxbridge Programme begins in Year 10 and is designed to guide and support students in making a successful Oxbridge application by Year 13. Specialist staff run weekly sessions covering various aspects of the application process, organise admissions test preparation with workshops led by Oxbridge postgraduates, and arrange mock interviews with Oxbridge alumni. Students also benefit from Oxbridge-style tutorials that go beyond the standard curriculum. Regular visits to Oxford, Cambridge, and other academic institutions further inspire ambition and strengthen students’ applications.
